## The Gift of the Magi

This morning, Mark Hatfield will be here to speak about the Magi project and our involvement in this ministry. The Magi Project is an outreach ministry of Healing Hands International, based in Nashville, TN, and provides Christmas gift boxes for kids across the world. The Magi Project name references the biblical story of the Wise Men ("magi" means wise man) visiting Jesus and bringing him gifts in Matthew 2. Some of you may know that we just passed Epiphany two weeks ago on January 6. Also called "Old Christmas," it is celebrated by the Amish and other groups as the day the Wise Men came to see Jesus. The Wise Men brought three gifts—gold, frankincense, and myrrh—each meant to symbolize something significant about the Christ child's life and mission. The Bible doesn't tell us directly the significance, but gold likely represented his status as a king, frankincense was a spice used in offerings, and myrrh was used in embalming. Jesus' mission was to die for our sins and these gifts each foreshadowed a part of that mission. Each of them would have been very expensive to give.

All of us have an opportunity to give something to God in our lives. It is tempting to allow our giving to God to be from our leftovers—time that we don't need, money we can't spend, energy that doesn't require much of us. The Wise Men's gift, and their visit, tell the story of something so much more precious and valuable. It is assumed, although we can't be sure, that the Wise Men started planning and taking this journey as soon as Jesus was born. By the time they got to Jesus, He was somewhere around 2 years old. Two years is a long time to dedicate to something, and a trip from Persia where they lived was a very dangerous trip. They gave expensive gifts—gold, frankincense and myrrh were costly. All of this leads us to the question, "What are we giving to Jesus?" Are we giving anything of value or of sacrifice, or are we giving Him the leftovers? How much time is dedicated to him? How much of our energy and our resources? How much of our attention?

The Magi Project is a great way to invest our time, money, and energy into something greater than ourselves. My hope is that our church can continue to be a part of this great work, living the legacy of the Wise Men who visited Jesus all those years ago.
